In the classrooms this week

I was really impressed by what I saw in Explorers this week. When I arrived with Mrs Kellerman, our Chair of Governors, on Tuesday, the children were very busy creating a swimming pool. The children were developing their ideas with Miss Idle and Mrs Bland, who shared with Mrs Kellerman and I lots of information about children's thoughts.
