In the classrooms this week

It was a great joy to walk around the school with Governors this week and showcase the work of our exciting classrooms.

When we visited the Explorers, they had decided to paint the feet of toy animals to show what patterns they made. The pages were full of bright shapes and beautiful designs. However (rather surprisingly!) what seemed to interest the children more was then taking the animals to the water tray and washing the paint off. They cleaned the toys so carefully and with real attention. Such caring learners!

Pioneers have been tackling some tricky numbers this week. The children have become really interested in making larger numbers, using different pieces of equipment to help them on their way. When Mrs Roe and I visited on Tuesday morning, the children showed off some impressive speed in relation to making and recognising different numbers too. The standard of the number work our Reception class is quite remarkable. Well done to them all!

It was lovely to visit Adventurers this week and see how their chocolate cake story is developing. All children confidently were able to share their ideas and were making some really impressive language choices in their writing too. The children are rightly proud of their work and it has been lovely to see so many of them rush to show me their achievements. It is great to see their confidence in writing flourishing.

Discoverers continued the fractions work this week and have been working hard to identify different fractions of amounts. When I visited earlier in the week, the children were tasked with a huge collection of objects that required lots of working out to find certain fractions. What was most impressive was the collaboration between the children and how they were discussing and sharing ideas. Such great examples of working together!

The Leaders have also been grappling with tricky maths problems this week. When I visited, it was wonderful to see the children applying their knowledge and understanding of maths concepts to a range of different problems. Seeing the children work through different ideas and explore possible solutions was impressive and certainly demonstrated the school's 'perseverance' Christian value. Great work.

We understand that sometimes, it is unavoidable to have to leave school early. We do not encourage making appointments during the school day, but know that this does happen.
