# In the classrooms this week

Despite it being the last week of the half term, there has been little rest around school. In many cases, the children have been working hard completing assessments and demonstrating the excellent progress that they have made. We look forward to sharing this information with you at parents' evening after the holidays.

When I have visited Explorers this week, they were enjoying building and being doctors or vets. On Thursday afternoon, a group of Explorers were challenging themselves to see if they could build a tower from bricks that was taller than they were. Their smiles when they achieved this goal were really special. Elsewhere, children have been using a range of tools to "make people better" – I even ended up with a bandaged arm!

Some of our Pioneers have visited the Community Centre across from school again this week. It is always so lovely to see some of our youngest children engage so beautifully with our elderly neighbours. The children are also showing some superb reading progress. I was blown away by a group of children who were completing some group reading tasks and were engaging with every word fluently. Simply amazing to see.

In Adventurers, I visited a phonics lesson this week. These activities help the children to understand different sounds and how these sounds can be used to write words. What I saw was impressive. All children were engaged and were showing a good understanding of what they were hearing and saying and then using this to make their own sentences. I have to also mention how impressed I was to see some of our Year 1 children joining their handwriting. Great work!

I also visited a Discoverers spelling lesson this week. What was great to see here was the confidence and enjoyment of every child in the lesson. I know how hard spelling is, but the children were absolutely loving their task of investigating different spelling rules. They were articulate about their learning, explaining clearly and with ease how each rule worked. What I really enjoyed seeing was how every child was also able to apply the many rules they had explored into words and sentences. Wonderful progress was so clear to see.

Finally, the whole school took part in collective worship on Thursday, led by our Leaders children. The focus was courage and the children presented two different drama pieces to show how courage had been shown (or should have been shown!) The children did a great job at engaging the whole school and questioning other classes about the courageous behaviour they had seen or what they should have seen. Mrs Vicar was also able to join us, as well as all staff members. Thank you to Leaders for approaching their worship planning and delivery with such sensitivity and maturity. You did yourselves very proud.
