In the classrooms this week

The Explorers have been "huffing and puffing" to blow houses down this week. As part of their work on The Three Little Pigs, our Explorers made their own straw, brick and wood homes before then getting Mr Big Bad Wolf's strong breath (a hairdryer) to try blowing them all down. The children made predictions about the strongest building and really enjoyed their investigations.

After creating animal footprints with our elderly neighbours from the community centre, the Pioneers have enjoyed exploring more about the marks that are left behind on the ground. When I visited on Thursday, two sand trays had been placed on the floor. The children had such excitement when placing their feet into the cold sand and identifying the print left behind. So much joy!

In Adventurers, the children have been making connections with their English and wider curriculum work. After enjoying the story of "The Smartest Giant in Town", the children have been writing thank you cards and creating their own crowns. The children used a range of materials to make their crowns fit for a King or Queen!

Discoverers have been enjoying making and investigating pulleys and levers over the last two weeks. It has been great to watch the children develop their own ideas and create model levers as part of their Design and Technology work. The children were using a range of technical terminology when I visited on Thursday. I know that they are looking forward to using their lever knowledge to make their own toys.

Our Year 6 children visited their secondary schools for the first time this week. It is quite scary to think that they have only a few weeks left at Sleights. Also in Leaders, the children have been working hard to create stock animation with Mrs Gurney, our computing specialist teacher. The children impressed me on Wednesday with their knowledge and understanding and how confidently they were able to produce their own animation work.
