Reading

We will be talking a lot about reading this year. Before the holidays, we added lots of new great books to our library collection that we hope the children will enjoy.

As you are aware, all children learn to read through colour banded books, before becoming a 'free reader'. However, with a change in expectations, all children will be again assigned to a colour banded book, even if, in the past, they have been made a 'free reader'. This is because there is still lots of learning to be done in the higher colour bands and we do not want our children to miss out on these key steps.

However, we also believe that every child should have the freedom to choose what they read. With this in mind, we have decided that all children, alongside their colour banded book, can choose a second book to read for pleasure and enjoyment. We will be reading with all children in the coming weeks to assign them a colour. Please do talk to staff about this if you have any questions.

Uniform

Thank you for making such a big effort to make sure our children come to school wearing correct uniform. They all look so smart. I wanted to clarify some issues that have been raised this week.

- Rucksacks Bringing a rucksack to school is discouraged. The cloakrooms are simply not big enough to fit these, in some cases, very large bags. A reading folder is preferred. However, particularly with older children, we recognise that there might be a need to bring a bag slightly larger than a reading packet. In these very few cases, a small rucksack should be brought. If staff feel the bag is unnecessarily large, however, we will ask families to not use them.
- Pencil cases These are not permitted in any class at school. All equipment is provided by the school.
- **Hair dye and nail varnish** At no point is this acceptable. Please use this weekend to remove any remnants that may still be lurking from the summer.
- Earrings These must not be worn in school. Where a child has had their ears pierced over the summer
 and they are not yet ready to be removed, they will not be able to take part in PE for health and safety
 reasons.

I do know that this, for some, may prove to be an unpopular decision. However, I would ask families to consider all children in school. It is not always easy to be able to provide the newest fashionable pencil case or bag and we know from the media that growing up is tough enough, without adding any extra pressure to our lovely children in relation to what design is on their bag. Thank you for your support with this.
