In the classrooms this week

Attendance

Over the term, we will continue to closely monitor children's attendance at school. Each school is expected to have an overall attendance target of 96%. I, once again, ask that no holidays are booked during term time and, where possible, can medical appointments be made outside of school hours, please.

Ongoing lateness is unacceptable and we will work with families to reduce this as quickly as possible. To tackle this, we will also be showing the number of children recorded as late each week on our newsletter.

As I mentioned before the holidays, we were experiencing a number of cases where high debts were being generated. To stop this, we will now ask that all monies are paid in advance, along with booking for sessions, unless this has been agreed in advance.
