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ParentPay

A HUGE thank you to you all for your outstanding support this week. It has been simply brilliant to see so many of our school families setting up their accounts and making the move to cashless. This has meant we have been able to manage snack orders, school lunches and breakfast/after school club bookings very easily. Thank you. Just a few reminders for next week, please:

- Snack orders must be placed for the full week by 9.00am each Monday morning.
- When choosing a snack with different flavour options, please use the 'Notes' box to add your child's choice.

We have been asked by a few families about late bookings to Kids Club, where an advance booking may not have been made because plans have changed or something has come up last minute. We know that this can happen, so we are happy to continue accepting these bookings. However, Wendy will not be able to take cash payments when you pick up, so families will need to log onto their Parent Pay account the following day, where the charge will show to pay.

Moving forwards, we have added all uniform items to Parent Pay too. So, if you require new cardigans, jumpers, book bags or PE bags, you can now order and pay for these on Parent Pay. We ask for the size cardigan or jumper you need to be recorded in the 'Notes' box when you buy. Mrs Stubbs will then deliver your order directly to your child, making it nice and easy for families.
