#### In the classrooms this week

- As always, there is just <u>so much</u> to celebrate in **Explorers** this week! The children have produced some amazing work, linked to patterns and textures on animals. I was very impressed to see the children carefully arrange patterns to make animals, before talking to adults about the various body parts. The work was beautiful. Elsewhere, the children have enjoyed writing and mark making too. We have been blown away by some of the pieces the children have created, linked to their 'On the Way Home' class text. Go, Explorers!

The children used natural materials from around the school and forest to combine with clay and create their own pieces of art. #### What was the last investigation you planned in Science? - Pupil Voice

We want to support our children to ask questions and investigate ideas. In our most recent pupil voice discussions, we found out from the children that:

- Across school, all children, despite the pandemic and school closures, could name an investigation that had been carried out.
- A variety of scientific language was being used in their answers (prediction, monitor, results).
- Children had enjoyed a range of investigations, including those completed as whole class and individual experiments
  planned and concluded independently in school.
- Our youngest children are encouraged to think of their own questions and then test out their theories. They are supported
  in recording their ideas scientifically.

We will continue supporting all children in understanding and using the steps required for scientific investigation to build confidence and skill in investigating an individual idea or theory.
