Summer Term Events

- **Sports Day** The children will have a bubble sports afternoon, but unfortunately, we will not be able to invite families to these celebrations. Due to the need to isolate and sanitise resources between use in different bubbles, not all classes will do their sports day activities at the same time, or on the same day. However, we will celebrate and share success for each bubble group on Tapestry.

- Transfer Events At the time of writing, we understand Year 6s will complete their transfer days at Caedmon College Whitby or Eskdale, but we will inform you if this information changes. In school, with almost all children not moving to a new teacher or class, transition tasks will be carried out between now and the end of term. Transfer Information for children joining us in Reception in September

We are really looking forward to welcoming our new group of Pioneers children to Sleights! 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Transfer Information for children moving to Year 1 in September

From **Tuesday 13th July** for the rest of the week, the Pioneers will stay with Mrs Brown, with regular visits from Mrs Hann. The children should be dropped off and picked up from their new classroom door (which will be shown to the children) for the week, please.

In the classrooms this week

- The **Explorers** have been creating some brilliant (if not somewhat messy) artwork this week. I was really excited to see lots of mud during the week, which was being used as paint! Children used this and other objects from outside to create their own very beautiful masterpieces. The children have continued enjoying their bear hunt tale, including going on several hunts. Thankfully, no bear has been found yet!
- **Pioneers** have been absolutely enthralled by a special visitor this week a wolf! The children received a basket from Little Red Riding Hood filled with some rather grim wolf items, including drool, ear wax and finger nails. This, as you can imagine, created lots of excitement for the Pioneers, who were so inspired, they wrote their own stories. The children have also been very busy making number representations in lots of different ways.
- Bubbles (non-Covid related ones!) created huge excitement for the **Learners** this week. As part of their writing work using the text 'Ocean Meets Sky', where there are lots of bubbles, Mrs Brown brought a bubble machine to really spark an interest and inspiration. Judging by the excellent work produced by the children, it is clear that this was a success! Well done to our Learners.
- The **Adventurers** had a great afternoon on Thursday. Identifying different forces, the children enjoyed exploring twisting, pulling and pushing around the classroom. The children labelled a range of items and objects around the room to show forces in action, before putting these in use to make clay snakes. The children created some super snakes using a range of forces.
- I was rather surprised when I visited **Discoverers** earlier in the week. As I approached, I could hear what sounded to be quite a disagreement! I was impressed (and relieved) to learn that the children were actually developing their expressive reading using Beowulf, so were very much in character! It was clear, the children were absolutely engaged and loving every moment of taking on the role of different characters.
- The **Leaders** have been tackling timetables this week and how these might be used in real life. Inspired by their class text, **Gargantis**, the children have been working hard to draft and edit their own chapter for the book. The children have thought carefully about how the book's characters will go on their own adventures and the discoveries they will make. I am really excited to read their final editions!
