IMPORTANT NOTICE for Year 6 families attending CAEDMON COLLEGE WHITBY

This morning we have learnt that the transfer days for the children to attend Caedmon College Whitby have now been cancelled. We include the following information from the school:

"It is with regret that we need to cancel our Year 6 Parents' Evening on 14 July, and also the transition days on 20th and 21st July. We are taking this step based on Local Authority guidance due to rising Covid cases. Further information will follow ASAP about alternative arrangements."

At the time of writing, a decision about transfer to Eskdale was pending, but we will update you when we know.

Absence from school

Thank you to all families for their support in supporting attendance at school. With a short time left at school, I wanted to take this opportunity to urge all families to remain highly vigilant to illness, including any symptoms of Covid-19.

We all know that infection rates of Covid-19 are rising and this is worrying. We all need to remain on our guard, whilst balancing everyday life. Where your child/ren is feeling unwell, **please do not** send them into school. This includes sickness bugs, high temperature, **any** coughing or feeling generally under the weather. It is a balancing act, as we know that hay fever is troubling a number of our children at the moment, but where a child is not well for any other reason, please keep them at home.

If a child is coughing **at all**, we ask that they have a PCR (test centre test) and do not return until the results have been given.

If a child has suffered stomach upset through sickness and diarrhoea, we ask that families keep the children at home for **at least** 48 hours from the last bout of sickness. Due to a significant lack of socialisation due to Covid-19 restrictions, the children's immunity is not as strong whilst usual bugs travel around.

In all cases, we ask that families keep us updated and inform us of any illness by 9.30am each morning. This can be done via email - <u>admin@sleights.n-yorks.sch.uk</u> (office) or <u>headteacher@sleights.n-yorks.sch.uk</u> (me). Alternatively, an answer machine message is fine too.

We are working really hard to ensure that the children's final weeks of what has been another very challenging year is a positive one. We welcome your continued support with managing illness to allow this happen.


To reach second position out of all schools nationally **AND** be the county champions all in one week is remarkable so a **HUGE WELL DONE** to Team Discoverers!




Class Photographs

School Meals - Advance notice of price increase from SEPTEMBER

For the last few years, the school has subsidised each meal for children and families at school. The Local Authority have now increased the cost for each meal to be made at school, which, in turn, has forced our governors to review how much we charge families for school meals. Despite a significant jump in the cost of each meal to the school, the governors have agreed to continue subsidising meals every day for families. This means that, from September, the cost of each meal will increase to £2.50 per day (£12.50 per week) A slight increase will also be made to Pre-School meal costs. This continues to provide great value!

From September, the current Year 2 children will no longer be eligible for free school meals (unless in receipt of benefit), so will be required to pay for school meals each week from September, using ParentPay.

Seaside Special Lunch - 15th July - next week

Mrs Eglon will be providing a special seaside themed menu on Thursday 15th July. The meal will be made up of: *Harry Ramsden's crispy battered fish, chips, peas and tomato ketchup, followed by doughnut muffins*

For children who usually have a packed lunch and would like to join in for the seaside special, the option has now been added to ParentPay (£2.40)

Leavers' Lunch – as chosen by our Year 6 children – 22nd July

After careful consideration, the Year 6s have decided the whole school menu for the 22nd July. It was a difficult choice! The whole school will enjoy: *Minced beef enchiladas, mixed salad and garlic bread, followed by artic roll and peaches (Leaders) / ice cream and peaches (rest of the school)*

For children who usually have a packed lunch and would like to join in for the Leavers' Lunch, the option has now been added to ParentPay (£2.40)



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End of year picnic - final day of term

As per tradition at Sleights, our final day will be celebrated with a picnic lunch. Unlike previous years, we are asking that teddy bears stay at home, to reduce the amount of items being brought into school, in line with our Covid risk assessment. The menu includes:
