Despite the restrictions, we are keen to ensure the Year 6 children leaving Sleights next week have a brilliant final few days. In addition to their afternoon tea this week, we have put together the following calendar for them, which we hope they will all enjoy.

- Monday 19th July Forest School (including Year 5) Please come to school in forest school clothes and bring a pair of spare shoes and a waterproof coat.

Swimming returns in September

After a year away from the pool, we are looking forward to restarting swimming lessons in September. This will be dependent on any restrictions in place at the time. Swimming will take place on **TUESDAY AFTERNOONS** for children in Mrs Walker and Mrs Roe's class (**Leaders** and **Adventurers**). Each session will cost £3.00 which includes hiring the pool and the cost of the bus. This amount is subsidised by the school.

If your child is in Adventurers or Leaders, we ask that you log on to ParentPay to provide consent and make payment for swimming sessions, please. We would be grateful if families could provide this consent before the summer. Payments can be made in one go, or weekly.



Music Lessons for Discoverers

As well as bringing back old favourites to our curriculum, we are excited to welcome new activities too! From September, the North Yorkshire County Council Music Service will be leading whole class music sessions for the Discoverers each week. The children will be provided with their own instrument to learn and practise at home, to support them create their very own class band. This is an exciting project and something we are all looking forward to seeing develop.

Summer Building Projects

Throughout the summer, you may see some work being carried out on the school site. A number of projects will be carried out on the school drainage system, which will involve digging up parts of the playground and laying new pipework. This will be carried out through August, but will be completed before our return in September.


No parking

The Summer Reading Challenge is back! Get started this weekend!

We are excited that Whitby Library is back up and running! This week, we received information about this year's summer reading challenge, which sounds fantastic! Children can once again sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge at their local library during the holidays. This year, the theme is Wild World Heroes and is all about nature and looking after the planet.

The challenge is to read 6 library books of the children's choice and collect special stickers and other prizes along the way – everyone who finishes will receive a limited edition Wild World Heroes medal and a certificate. Any child aged 4 to 11 can join in and the challenge runs from Sat 10th July until Sat 11th Sept.

School Reading Books - reminder

We will be collecting all reading books in and not handing out new texts in the last week of term. Over the summer, we will be working hard to refresh and update some of our reading colour bands, so that the children can enjoy reading new books. If you have any school books at home, please do return these to help us with our update and refresh.

We hope that children can continue reading over the summer by taking part in the summer reading challenge.

Milk in School - Reminder

Children currently in Reception receive free milk each day. From September, these children will be able to continue having milk, for a small charge. To apply for milk, families need to book this online through the 'Cool Milk' website.

For children currently in Pre-School and moving to Reception class in September, milk will be provided for each child at no cost, so no action is required.

School Meals - Advance notice of price increase from SEPTEMBER

For the last few years, the school has subsidised each meal for children and families at school. The Local Authority have now increased the cost for each meal to be made at school, which, in turn, has forced our governors to review how much we charge families for school meals. Despite a significant jump in the cost of each meal to the school, the governors have agreed to continue subsidising meals every day for families. This means that, from September, the cost of each meal will increase to £2.50 per day (£12.50 per week) A slight increase will also be made to Pre-School meal costs. This continues to provide great value!

From September, the current Year 2 children will no longer be eligible for free school meals (unless in receipt of benefit), so will be required to pay for school meals each week from September, using ParentPay.
