Swimming returns in September

After a year away from the pool, we are looking forward to restarting swimming lessons in September. This will be dependent on any restrictions in place at the time. Swimming will take place on **TUESDAY AFTERNOONS** for children in Mrs Walker and Mrs Roe's class (**Leaders** and **Adventurers**). Each session will cost £3.00 which includes hiring the pool and the cost of the bus. This amount is subsidised by the school.

If your child is in Adventurers or Leaders, we ask that you log on to ParentPay to provide consent and make payment for swimming sessions, please. We would be grateful if families could provide this consent before the summer. Payments can be made in one go, or weekly.



Music Lessons for Discoverers

As well as bringing back old favourites to our curriculum, we are excited to welcome new activities too! From September, the North Yorkshire County Council Music Service will be leading whole class music sessions for the Discoverers each week. The children will be provided with their own instrument to learn and practise at home, to support them create their very own class band. This is an exciting project and something we are all looking forward to seeing develop.



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Summer Building Projects

Throughout the summer, you may see some work being carried out on the school site. A number of projects will be carried out on the school drainage system, which will involve digging up parts of the playground and laying new pipework. This will be carried out through August, but will be completed before our return in September.

We have also had a number of meetings about our new buildings and hope that plans will be shared soon, as planning permission is sought.



Breakfast Club Changes from September

An increasing number of our families are requesting an early start to our breakfast club provision. As a result, we have decided to make this option available for all families from September. This will mean that breakfast club will open from **7.45am each morning**. A slight increase in cost will be made to cover the cost of this additional time.

From September, the two session prices will be:

- From 7.45am and including breakfast: £3.00
- From 8.30am and including no breakfast: £1.50



The Summer Reading Challenge is back! Get started this weekend!

We are excited that Whitby Library is back up and running! This week, we received information about this year's summer reading challenge, which sounds fantastic! Children can once again sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge at their local library during the holidays. This year, the theme is Wild World Heroes and is all about nature and looking after the planet.

The challenge is to read 6 library books of the children's choice and collect special stickers and other prizes along the way – everyone who finishes will receive a limited edition Wild World Heroes medal and a certificate. Any child aged 4 to 11 can join in and the challenge runs from Sat 10th July until Sat 11th Sept.

School Meals - Advance notice of price increase from SEPTEMBER

For the last few years, the school has subsidised each meal for children and families at school. The Local Authority have now increased the cost for each meal to be made at school, which, in turn, has forced our governors to review how much we charge families for school meals. Despite a significant jump in the cost of each meal to the school, the governors have agreed to continue subsidising meals every day for families. This means that, from September, the cost of each meal will increase to £2.50 per day (£12.50 per week) A slight increase will also be made to Pre-School meal costs. This continues to provide great value!

From September, the current Year 2 children will no longer be eligible for free school meals (unless in receipt of benefit), so will be required to pay for school meals each week from September, using ParentPay.

Menu for the first week back	
Wednesday	Macaroni cheese, green beans, sweetcorn and wholemeal bread, followed by fruit muffin
Thursday	Mexican tortilla boats, rice, carrots and broccoli, followed by yogurt
Friday	Breaded salmon, jacket potato, peas, beans and wholemeal bread, followed by chocolate banana sponge and chocolate sauce.

Sleights is a nut free and peanut free school.



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
