News from Sleights

Well done to everyone for a brilliant week at Sleights. Our classrooms, once again, have been jam packed with lots of great activities, but it has also been lovely to enjoy some learning outside, with trips and sporting fixtures.

The **Explorers** have been tuning into sounds this week. After learning about body parts, the children have been exploring the work of our senses. Explorers have enjoyed hearing and describing different noises around the room and using technology. It was great for the children to talk about what they could hear the sounds they recognised.

It has been fantastic to see so much writing this week in our **Pioneers'** classroom. I was very impressed to see the children writing a bank of words when I visited on Thursday afternoon. It is clear so much learning has taken place with phonics! It has been fascinating to see so many conkers used in play too!

The **Learners** have enjoyed their history topic this week, where they have been learning about toys and how they have changed. The children made their own replicas of old toys, creating a catch ball, using string, foil and cups. The Learners worked hard to make their toys, but even harder to play with them. It looked fun, but really tricky!

It has been a joy to welcome singing back to Sleights this term. I have really enjoyed hearing the Adventurers rehearse their Harvest Festival contributions and I know you will enjoy seeing these in a few weeks too! The children have also continued to work hard with swimming and building their knowledge about living in France.

It has been an incredibly busy week for our **Discoverers** and **Leaders!** The week began with a visit from Louise, a drama specialist who enjoyed working with our children to bring their history topic to life. The children used their impressive knowledge of the Tudors to act out scenes and events from history, including the wives of Henry VIII. It looked and sounded amazing.

Later in the week, the **Discoverers** and **Leaders** enjoyed a trip to the Scarborough Spa Engineering event. The children returned to tell me it was "amazing!" and their smiles certainly showed this! Some of the children created a report from the event, to share what they got up to:

"We had an exciting day looking at lots of different stalls which advertised many companies. We learned about the different equipment used by the NHS, including a 3D printer, used code to solve problems with GCHQ and tested our memory with a game at the McCain's stall. We enjoyed being encouraged to move into a career where there are no barriers to gender or background!"

Reading Books - We need your help




