The **Pioneers** have been learning about animals this week and their different habitats. The children have enjoyed talking about the things animals need, which included discussions around food chains and predators. The children worked hard to create animal homes using models and boxes, creating some great language and writing from everyone.

The **Learners** been studying the weather this week, recording the temperature outside and the weather each day on their own charts. The children have painted pictures of different types of weather too. The Learners have also enjoyed getting familiar with the Aldi advert of "A Christmas Carrot", to inspire our next writing topic. What a busy week!

When I visited the **Adventurers** on Monday afternoon, they were busy creating sculpture replicas of Stonehenge. The children were carefully discussing their models and were working hard to make these realistic. The children also tested out light from the sun (using a torch) on their models to explore how important the sun is. The children also made people and rafts they used to transport the stones. They've really enjoyed this!

This week, the **Discoverers** adopted a class panda! This was as a result of the children's work studying Asia earlier in the term, linked to the book 'The Firework Maker's Daughter'. The children are really excited to receive regular updates about their adoption. The class are also so looking forward to sharing their English work with Henderson's Estate Agents. They have produced some very professional home adverts, including many Tudor features.

In their classroom, the **Leaders** have been finalising and publishing their house details, using their best powers of persuasion to sell a Tudor property. The children have also been using their artistic skills in the form of Batik, making backdrops for our next design and technology project. Illness and absence from school

I am really grateful for families working with us to try and reduce the spread of any winter bugs or illness in school. However, I just wanted to remind everyone of a few points relating to absence and illness:

- If your child has vomited or had diarrhoea, they should not attend for a **full 48 hours** since their last bout of illness. This is an NHS requirement and something enforced for all at Sleights, including staff.
- We understand the difficulties in finding suitable appointments (dentist, opticians, doctor) but would ask, where reasonably possible, that these are made in advance for outside of school time. We understand that emergency appointments don't work like this, so in these cases, please let us know if a child is missing from school due to medical appointments.
- If your child is absent from school, please let us know as soon as possible (before 9.30am each day) This can
 be done through a variety of ways email to me or the school office (both addresses are on the newsletter)
 Text the school mobile number or give us a ring. We are not always able to get to the phone on a morning, but
 we do pick up voice messages.
- Mrs Stubbs will make contact with families where we have not heard a reason for absence after 9.30am, so please help us by sharing this information as soon as you can. Thank you.
