After the Last Post was played, the children paused for two minutes to reflect and remember, before some of our Year 6s shared words from 'For the Fallen'. In the classrooms, the **Explorers** have been exploring the sense of touch. The children have talked about their favourite textures and described how different ones feel. The children have also enjoyed some outdoor PE activities using some of our new equipment. A trip to the library was also a very popular event this week. What a busy week! Go, Explorers!

Pioneers have loved the great outdoors this week, as they have spent two days in the school forest. The children have enjoyed gathering natural objects to help them create their own leaf people and artwork, as part of their story telling activities. The children also carried out a matching hunt to explore and find beautiful autumn colours, as well as getting stuck into some printing. Great work, Pioneers.

In Learners, the children have shared the Bible story of Jonah and the Whale, exploring how forgiveness is shown. The children have also been busy designing, making and evaluating their own space rockets, linked to a newspaper article they are writing about a space visit. To mark Remembrance Day, the children also created fields of poppy paintings and displayed these at home time. This work looked stunning.

The Adventurers have enjoyed using story maps this week to help them retell events for their newspaper reports. The children worked hard to combine their own drawings and words to plan their work and structure. The children also worked hard to create their own watercolour poppies, as part of the Remembrance Day reflections.

In **Discoverers**, the children have enjoyed writing a newspaper article about the Spanish Armada. They have captured many key points within the battle, and been able to speak confidently about Sir Francis Drake's sneaky tactics. The children have also worked tirelessly on the Sundog contest across school with some super success!

Finally, the Leaders have been engrossed in writing their newspaper reports sharing Tudor knowledge; many sharing the gruesome details of the demise of Henry VIII's wives! This has definitely helped them remember this Tudor knowledge. The Year 6s continue to impress us - well done, Leaders!


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Sumdog Challenge


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Sleeps Until Santa - with 'This is the Coast' radio station

This will involve the children answering 25 times tables question on screen, with six seconds for each question.
