News from Sleights

It has been exciting to see a number of new resources being shared in the **Explorers'** classroom this week. In recent weeks, the children have shown a real interest and fascination with vehicles and roads, so they have really enjoyed playing with their new road rug, as well as creating their own large map of Sleight. The children offered some great ideas about buildings in the village and where the roads should be placed.

Communication is so important in the Early Years and this week, the **Pioneers** have used lots of language to talk all things rockets this week. The children have been working tirelessly to design, draw, make and write about them. I was blown away by the level of discussion and detail included in children's work and the annotations they made to their designs. One of the children shared that "Being an engineer sounds like a good idea".

In **Learners**, the children have been finding out about the oceans in geography. Combining this knowledge with their work in art, the children worked hard on Thursday to create a collage representation of the ocean. The children enjoyed choosing different colours and textures to represent this. Learners also told me they have been loving their work on the two times table.

The **Adventurers** have been creating algorithms in computing this week. When I visited, the children were working with intense focus to create their commands and make their sequence work and repeat. The children were really proud to have been able to create their algorithms and were excited to share their work.

The **Discoverers** were keen to talk about some of their highlights with me this week. The children shared updates about their progress at swimming, more music on Thursday and how much they had enjoyed maths this week. The children also enjoyed telling me about their class text - "The Wild Robot".

The **Leaders** shared their enjoyment of RE this week, explaining their work about Hinduism. The children also talked about their work about their own physical and emotional wellbeing. I was impressed by the level of discussion that the children had, as they told me some of the ways we can keep ourselves physically and mentally well. We will be working closely with our school wellbeing nurse in the coming weeks to continue developing this work.

- On the left hand side of the screen, you will see a big menu of guides and courses, which can be completed at home. We are encouraging families to spend time completing the "Annual Certificate in Online Safety" to help increase understanding and safety at home.

We are working hard to promote online safety across school, including ongoing staff training for staff and online safety lessons in the classroom. We hope that this work, alongside families signing up, will help us achieve a National Online Safety award.

Recorders
