Coronavirus - update

As families will be aware, 1st April marks a change in how we are asked to manage cases of Coronavirus. As schools, we have been provided with the following information, which will form the basis of our own response at Sleights.

- Children and young people **who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home** and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

We know that this updated advice may take some adjustment, but please do discuss any worries or questions with school staff.
