Staying Safe – “Huggy Wuggy”

This week, families have been telling us about “Huggy Wuggy”. Whilst this sounds gentle and harmless, the reality is very different. We understand that across the country, children are talking about “Huggy Wuggy”, who appears in a YouTube video. The creature has rows of sharp teeth. The video content includes talk of death and whispers horrible things in your ear whilst giving hugs. They also sing songs with challenging lyrics. The nature of the gentle “Huggy Wuggy” name means that the content often gets through filters, which means it is easy to watch at home. We wanted to share this update with families, so that everyone has the same information about the potentially inappropriate content that might be being viewed. Please let us know if you need any support with this.

Thank you for your feedback

Last week, we asked for your views about bullying and behaviour at Sleights. We have been really pleased to see so many responses and received some great feedback. A key message for us to take away is that 100% of families who responded said that their child was happy in school and well we teach the children how to stay safe. This is great news. On **Tuesday 17th May**, we will be joined by Tempest Photography, who will take class pictures. The images will be available to purchase by families. More information closer to the time.

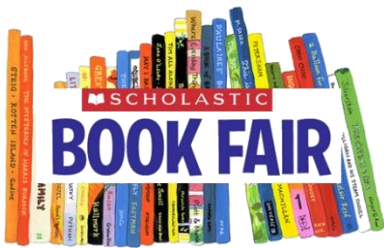
A message to EXPLORERS families
