What will the Leaders be learning this term?

Mathematics	
<p>We will be building fluency, reasoning and problem solving in:</p> <p>Year 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Shape: Children will learn to estimate measure and calculate angles in a range of shapes and on a straight line and at a point. They will also explore regular and irregular polygons as well as 3d shapes.• Position and direction: Children will learn to read and plot coordinates and to solve problems with coordinates. They will be introduced to translation and will build on their prior knowledge of symmetry and reflection.• Decimals: Children will multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000 and complete decimal sequences• Negative numbers: Children will learn to count through zero in ones and multiples. They will compare and order negative numbers before finding the difference between these numbers.• Converting units: Children will learn to convert units of measure and to calculate with timetables.• Children will learn to compare and estimate volume. <p>Year 6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Shape: In this unit, children will focus on calculating angles in a range of shapes such as triangles, quadrilaterals and polygons. They will learn about the parts of a circle before focussing on nets of 3D shapes.• Position and direction: Children will plot points in four quadrants and find missing coordinates before learning about reflection and translation.	<p>Our times table focus this term will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We will be continuing to revise and reinforce times tables learned and applying them to our maths work.
