This half term, we will be reading It's Up To Us by Christopher Lloyd.

We will also enjoy a variety of non-fiction books relating to our topics this term, together with sharing fiction and non-fiction books together each day from our School library.

What will the LEARNERS be learning this term?

Mathematics

We will be building fluency, reasoning and problem solving in:

- Place Value. sorting and counting objects, counting forwards and backwards from a given number, recognising numbers as words.
- $\bullet \quad \text{Addition and subtraction.} \quad \text{- one more than and one less than, number bonds, using part-whole models.}$

Year 1 will work with numbers within 10. Year 2 will work with numbers to 100.

 \bullet $\;$ Shape – recognising, sorting and making patterns with 3D and 2D shapes.

Year 2 will also learn about lines of symmetry, sides, vertices, faces and edges of shapes.

We will be using the manipulatives – Numicon, Number Frames, Diennes Rods, number tracks and squares.

Our times table focus this term will be: 10 times table

 We will be focusing on drawing. Our focus artists are Pablo Picasso and Paul Klee. We will be using a range of dry materials to mark-make, including pastels, chalk and charcoal. We will investigate tone, using different techniques. We will explore a variety of drawing starting points, such as observational, landscape and portrait.
