#### Mathematics

- Exploring Number to 10, with opportunities to compare, count and play with the composition.

<ul> <li>Making our own maps of real and fictional locations</li> <li>Look at a variety of maps -real and fictional, related to story telling</li> <li>A visit to our Church and making comparisons with other places of worship</li> <li>Thinking about celebrations and faiths</li> <li>Considering clothes for the different seasons</li> </ul>	Mrs Gurney will teach us about: • Programming language using the Beebots	<ul> <li>How things change over time. We will look at a selection of items (telephones, cameras, record player, typewriter and sewing machine and look at similarities and differences and change over time). We will look closely and ask questions.</li> <li>Talk to our families to ask questions about the past and memories, to find out what and when things happened.</li> <li>Using the words now and then, yesterday, today and tomorrow, past, present and future.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Visit the forest and become more familiar with the trees and plants growing there, noting changes over the season</li> <li>Learn about the animals and their habitat, noticing activity on site.</li> <li>Notice the changes over Winter into Spring-weather, daylight, plants and animals.</li> <li>Look at what things are made of and notice their different properties.</li> <li>Start to use words to describe properties, for example, magnetic/non-magnetic, flexible/rigid, smooth/rough, float/sink</li> <li>Explore forces with magnets and pushing and pulling, water and air rockets.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Listen to a variety of music including Dance of the Knights-Prokofiev and Hall of the Mountain King-Greig</li> <li>Small world play to support story-telling and map making</li> <li>Role play and dressing up relating to the Elves and the Shoemaker.</li> <li>Exploring with colour and textures</li> <li>Making with a selection of small and large parts for example, computer parts and junk</li> <li>Creating plans</li> <li>Use a selection of musical instruments</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Exploring materials to find out about their properties</li> <li>Sorting materials</li> <li>Making models with machine parts, blocks and junk.</li> <li>Observational drawing and painting</li> <li>Making rockets and vehicles</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Big Building-indoors and out</li> <li>Dance</li> <li>PE-using equipment to perform actions, perform a variety of skips and jumps.
