Mathematics

We will be building fluency, reasoning and problem solving in:

- Multiplication & Division Multiplying and dividing a 2, 3 and 4 digit number by a 2 digit number
- Fractions Finding fractions of an amount and multiplying fractions
- Decimals & Percentages Equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages
- Perimeter & Area Perimeter of rectangles, rectilinear shapes and regular polygons, area of rectangles and compound shapes
- Statistics Draw and interpret line graphs and interpret tables and timetables
