- Visiting the library


To help us read and write, we will:

- Have daily Little Wandle Phonics sessions
- Look at letter shapes taught in line with the introduction of each GPC
- Build up to writing words
- Read in a group 3 times a week to build fluency and expression
- The classroom is set up to allow mark making and writing in all areas. Writing will grow alongside the teaching of phonics. Story maps develop adding words to the pictures.

Mathematics

We will be building fluency, reasoning and problem solving in:

- Opportunities to collect, compare and sort.
- Opportunities to notice what is the same and what is different-making comparisons
- Subitising-add definition
- Counting-Add detail
- Exploring composition of number to see smaller numbers within a larger collection
- Compare length, weight and capacity
- Select, rotate and manipulate shapes

Every day we will:

- Notice number and pattern around us using the phrases "I wonder...", "What are you noticing?" and "What can you see?"
- Subitise
- Compare
- Count
- Use loose parts, Numicon, Number Frames, counters and blocks
