Early Years Provision at Sleights

Session Fees – January 2024

Two Year Old Provision

Private Session Fees

Session fees are detailed below. A monthly invoice will be issued for sessions in advance, with information and details about how the fees have been calculated and how to pay.

Funded Places

Your two year old child may be eligible for 15 hours of funded childcare, depending on income and the receipt of certain benefits.

Am I eligible?	To be eligible for a funded two-year-old place, you must receive one of the following benefits or credits: income support; - child tax credit and have a joint annual income not over £16,190; - working tax credits and have a joint annual income of no more than £16,190; - the working tax credit four-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for working tax credit) - income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA); - income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA); - universal credit - from 1 April 2018, if you are entitled to universal credit you must have an annual net earned income equivalent to and not exceeding £15,400, assessed on up to three of your most recent universal credit assessment periods; - support through part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act; - or the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.

What information does the school need?	- A member of our team will provide you with a 'Parental Agreement Form' to complete with the hours you would like your child to attend. - The school will also need your voucher code (given to you once applied) which is also shared with the school on the agreement form.

Three and Four Year Old Provision

Funded Places

All three and four year old children are entitled to 15 hours childcare per week. Your child may be eligible for 30 hours of funded childcare, depending on income and the receipt of certain benefits.

Am I eligible?	The national eligibility criteria which families need to meet are: both parents must be working (or the sole parent if in a lone parent family); • each parent must have a weekly minimum income equivalent to 16 hours at national minimum wage or national living wage; and • each parent must have an income less than £100,000 per year. The definition of 'working' includes employed people, self-employed people, and parents on zero hours contracts who meet the above criteria. What if one parent doesn't work? • In a two parent family, both parents must work and fit the criteria above. • In a single parent family, the lone parent must work.
How do I apply?	• You do not need to apply for the 15 hours of funded childcare. • If you are entitled to 30 hours (known as 'Extended entitlement', you can apply by accessing the Childcare Choices website and creating an account.
What information does the school need?	• A member of our team will provide you with a 'Parental Agreement Form' to complete with the hours you would like your child to attend. • If you receive extended entitlement, the school will also need your voucher code (given to you once applied) which is also shared with the school on the agreement form.
